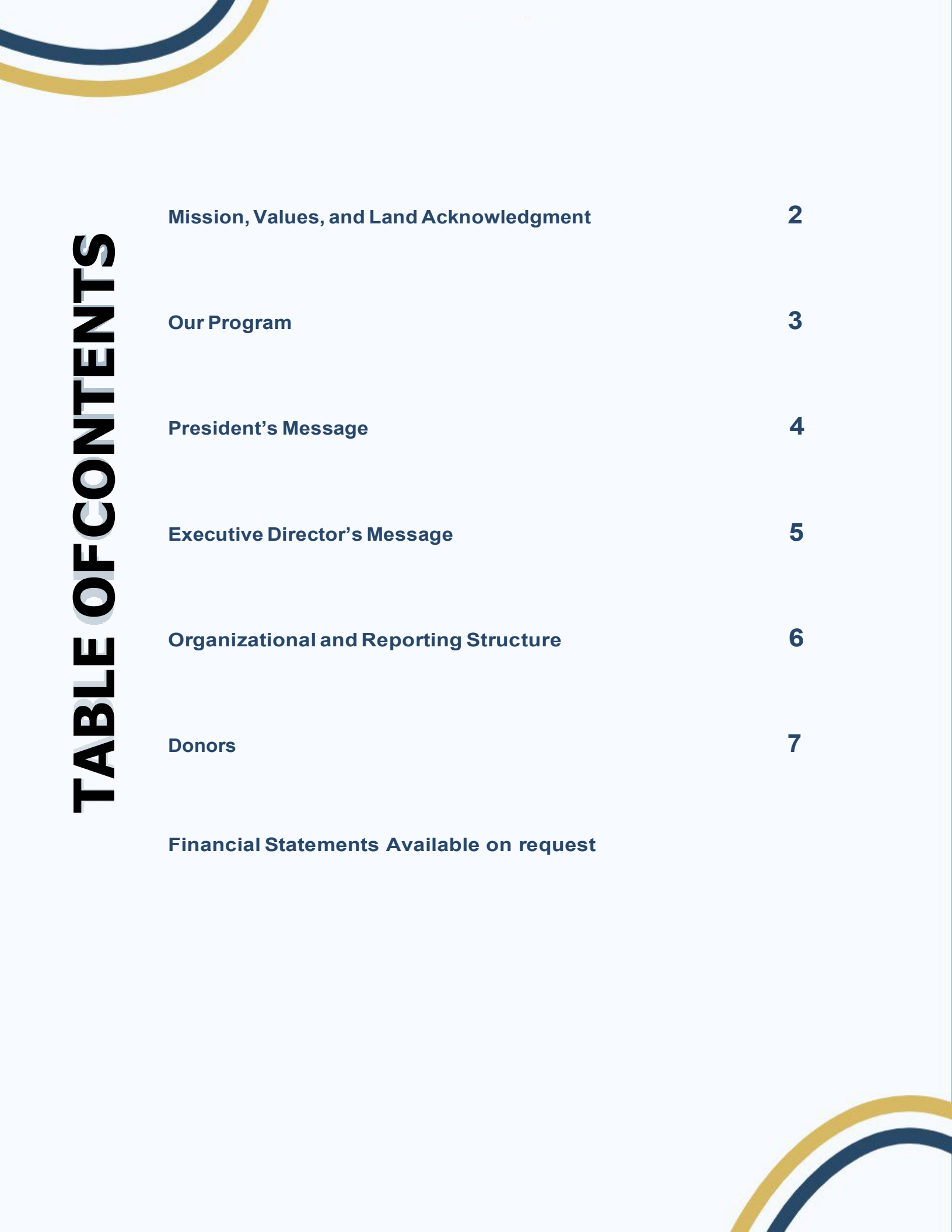

ABOUT OUR PROGRAM

Two Ten Recovery Inc. is a not-for-profit organization founded in 2007, with the goal of providing supportive transitional housing for individuals recovering from addiction. Our objective is to offer the necessary supports to help individuals rebuild their lives, becoming contributing members to their families and communities.

Winnipeg faces a critical shortage of after-care programs for those who have completed 30-90-day substance treatment. This lack of supportive housing makes sustained recovery difficult. Two Ten Recovery helps fill this gap by offering structured, substance-free homes designed to foster long-term recovery. Our locations include Destiny House, 210 Maryland, Cole's Cottage, and as of 2024, third stage housing at 255 Guelph.

Through our quality programming, residents learn essential life skills such as personal hygiene, meal planning, cooking, and housecleaning. Residents also build communication skills and foster positive relationships, with many reuniting with their families, including regaining visitation rights with their children. Our staff help our residents with goal setting, towards upgrading education, pursuing further training, volunteering, and ultimately gainful employment. Most importantly, residents deepen their dedication to sobriety and embrace a healthier substance-free life.



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This past year saw many success stories among the individuals who chose to make Two Ten Recovery a part of their journey. I am honoured and humbled that so many people decided to make it their homes for a period, usually three to 18 months. Two Ten Recovery now houses 37 individuals, supporting their journey, goals and recovery to lead them to be successful in our community.

Many people found work, continued their studies, and/or were reunited with their children. It brings me joy to know that we helped people feel whole and we were part of the process in helping them maintain sobriety.

I'm grateful to our donors that contribute greatly to our Residents' continued journey. **We could not do the work we do without you!** Thank you to our many volunteers who serve our homes and who volunteer on our board. I'm grateful to our staff who support our residents. Without all these people, we would be nothing.

We contribute so much and rarely take the time to stop and reflect on that. We are constantly upgrading and repairing our properties. This ensures continued comfort for our residents and improves our communities and our city.

New windows and upgrades were made to 210 Maryland and 185 Balmoral. Upgrades are a constant, but the homes look amazing.

The Province of Manitoba HAH department, Manitoba Liquor and Lotteries, the United Way, The Winnipeg Foundation, the Jewish Foundation of Manitoba, and private donors have all contributed to making all 4 homes comfortable and safe.

Just prior to year end this year, the HAH Department of the Province announced a one-time extra grant to relieve the constant financial pressure the addiction agencies have been facing. We are very grateful for this additional funding.

REPORTING STRUCTURE

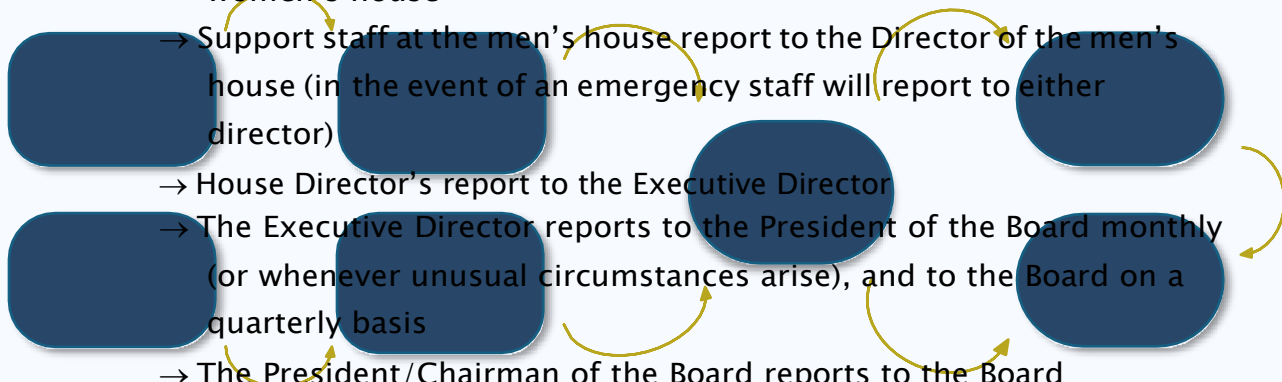
→ Support staff at the women's house report to the Director of the women's house
